

About the Webinar:

Discourses on Community, Culture and Conflict, particularly in the context of globalization, continue to resonate with the lived experience of people all over the world. Issues of governance in the management of conflicts in multiethnic societies have been further complicated by continuing reliance on dubious approaches such as cultural homogenization.

The terms "Community", "Culture" and "Conflict", which have a wide array of 'real' as well as 'imagined' connotations in Third World countries, need to be both conceptualized and contextualized as they demand to be refracted through the twin prisms of gender, empowerment and livelihood.

The webinar will seek to focus on the contradictions inherent in globalization; its aggregating, assimilating capacity as well as its power to create fissiparous tendencies of socio-economic and political segmentation. The webinar will also bring into the ambit of its discussion some burning by-products of Globalization— assimilation, migration, corporatization, environmental degradation, diasporas and displacement— in a bid to arrive at a more humanitarian understanding of these global problems.

Dr. Elham Hossain, Associate Professor, Dhaka City College, Bangladesh

Topic: The Community, Gender and Intersectionality: A Re-reading of Third World Feminism from the Perspective of the Subcontinent.

Dr. Elham Hossain is a Bangladeshi academic, essayist, translator, editor and literary critic. He has done his B.A. (Honours) and Masters in English Literature. He has received M. Phil. on Colonial Literature and Ph.D. on the Nigerian author Chinua Achebe's novels from the University of Dhaka.

He writes both in Bangla and English. He has authored six books. *Angst and Anxieties: Historical and Psychological parallels in Chinua Achebe's Trilogy, Africa: Sahitya O Nondonbhabna (Africa: Literature and Aesthetics), Africar Chotogolpo O Sahityochinta* are some of his seminal books. He has translated Chinua Achebe's *Things Fall Apart* and *The Trouble with Nigeria* into Bangla.

Dr. Hossain has nineteen years of experience in teaching the students of UG and PG levels. He was a faculty member in **Rajshahi University of Science and Technology** and **National University, Bangladesh**.
